## Dinosaurs! Year 1 home discovery grid, term 3

<u>English</u>	<u>Maths</u>	<u>Topic</u>
Share stories and poems about dinosaurs with your grown ups. Take on the role of storyteller for any younger members of your family.	Find 5-10 objects in your house that you can measure. You can then order the objects from smallest to largest and record what you have found in your book. If you have a ruler or tape measure at home, you can measure each object in CMs.	Work with an adult at home to research more amazing facts about the age of the dinosaurs. You can then create a poster or fact file about the amazing facts you have found.
Entertain your family and friends by reading them some side-splitting dinosaur jokes or astounding dinosaur facts.	See how many different addition and subtraction calculations you can write with the answer of 10, or 20. For example, $1+9=10$ $2+8=10$ $2+7=10$	Using different resources/ junk modelling, create a dinosaur mask or hat and bring it to school. These can be shared with your friends and displayed in the class.
Draw a picture of your favourite dinosaur. You can label your picture with some interesting facts. To challenge yourself write a description of the Dinosaur with lots of interesting facts. You could even make a fact file!	Have a shape hunt at home. I wonder how many different shapes you can find. You can then create a maths poster about the different shapes in your house.	Watch the birds in your garden or local park. Look at them closely, what kind of birds can you spot? Do you think they walk like dinosaurs? You can take pictures and share them on our Facebook page or draw the birds in your books.
<u>PE</u> Take part in a homemade PE/ sports activity. This might be a walk, exploring where you live, a race, a bike ride, a bouncing competition on a trampoline or even a game of football, it's up to you. You could share your activity on Facebook or describe it in your book.	<u>Values Poster</u> Make a poster about what communication means to you!	<u>Cooking Challenge</u> Taste or make some a dish fit for a dinosaur. Will you make a dish for a herbivore, carnivore or omnivore? You could challenge yourself and write a food review, describing what you have eaten. You can take pictures and share them on our Facebook page or draw the dish in your books.
